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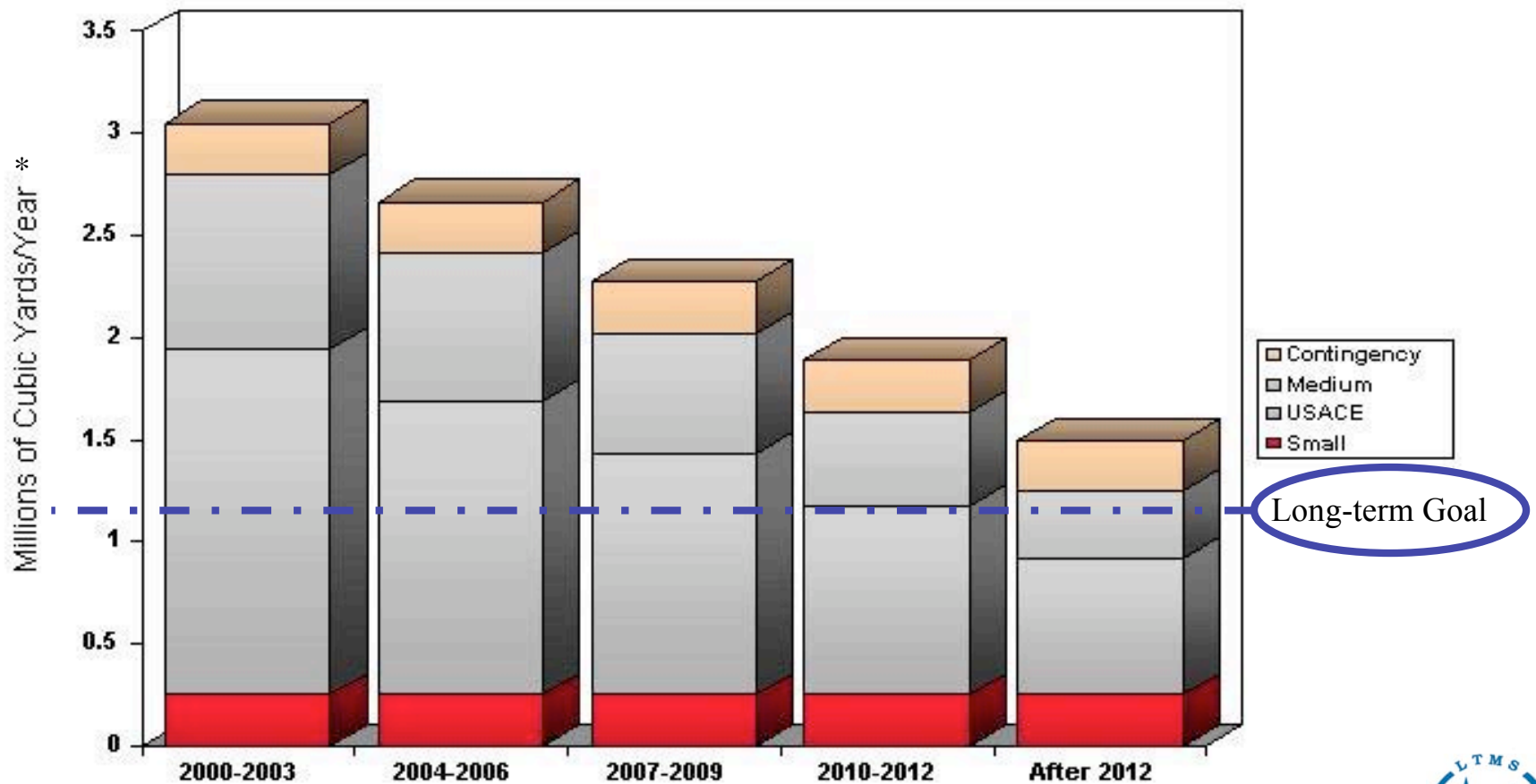

RMP and Small Dredgers

- RMP intended to give small dredgers a break on fees
- LTMS will significantly reduce in-bay disposal
- Hamilton ATF is key to LTMS success
- BUT Hamilton may result in mainly small dredgers disposing in-bay
- Thus, under current fee structure small dredgers could pay most non-Corps RMP fees

Transition to the LTMS “40/40/20 Plan” Began in 2001

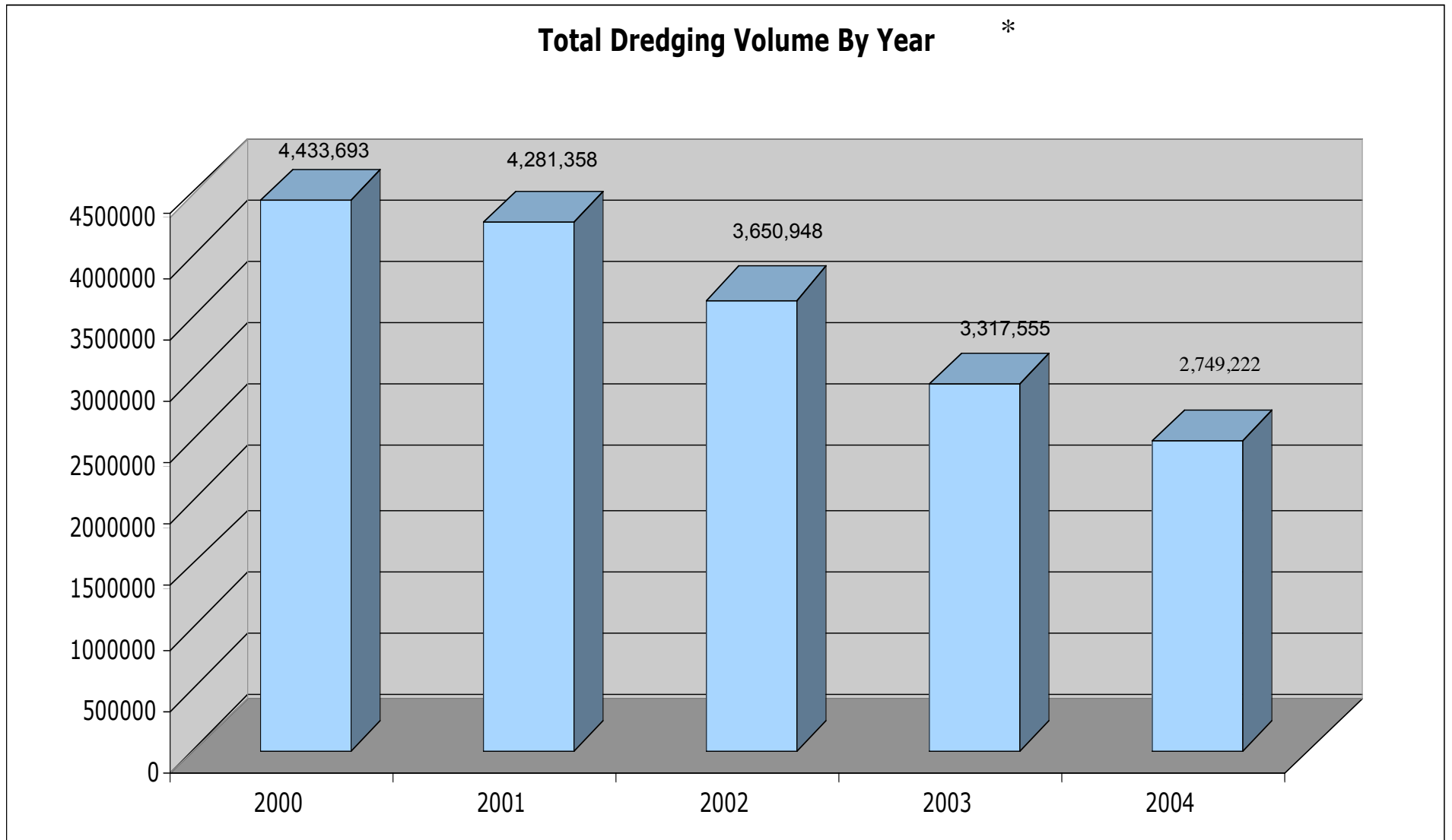
In-Bay Disposal: Transition Targets



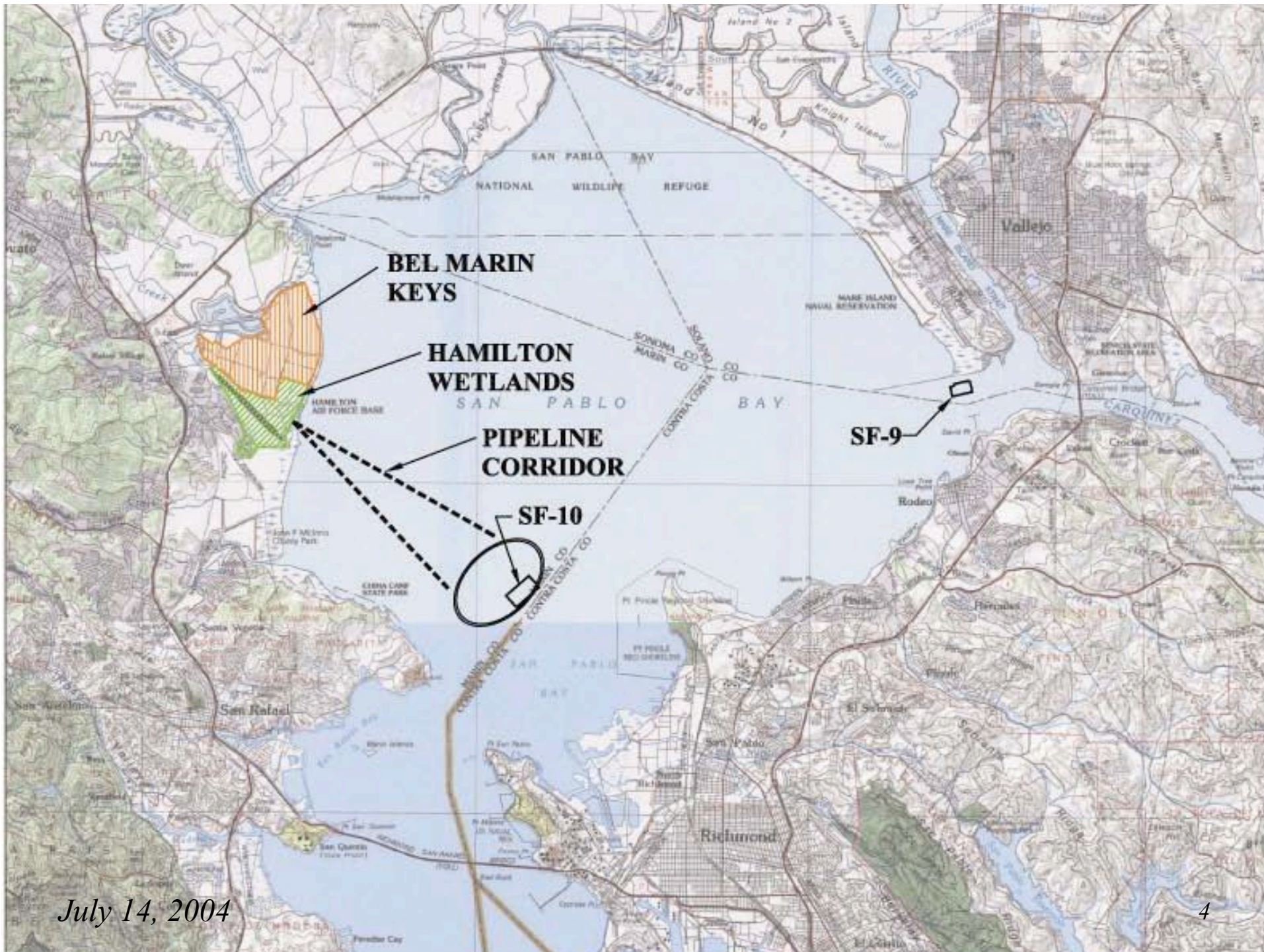

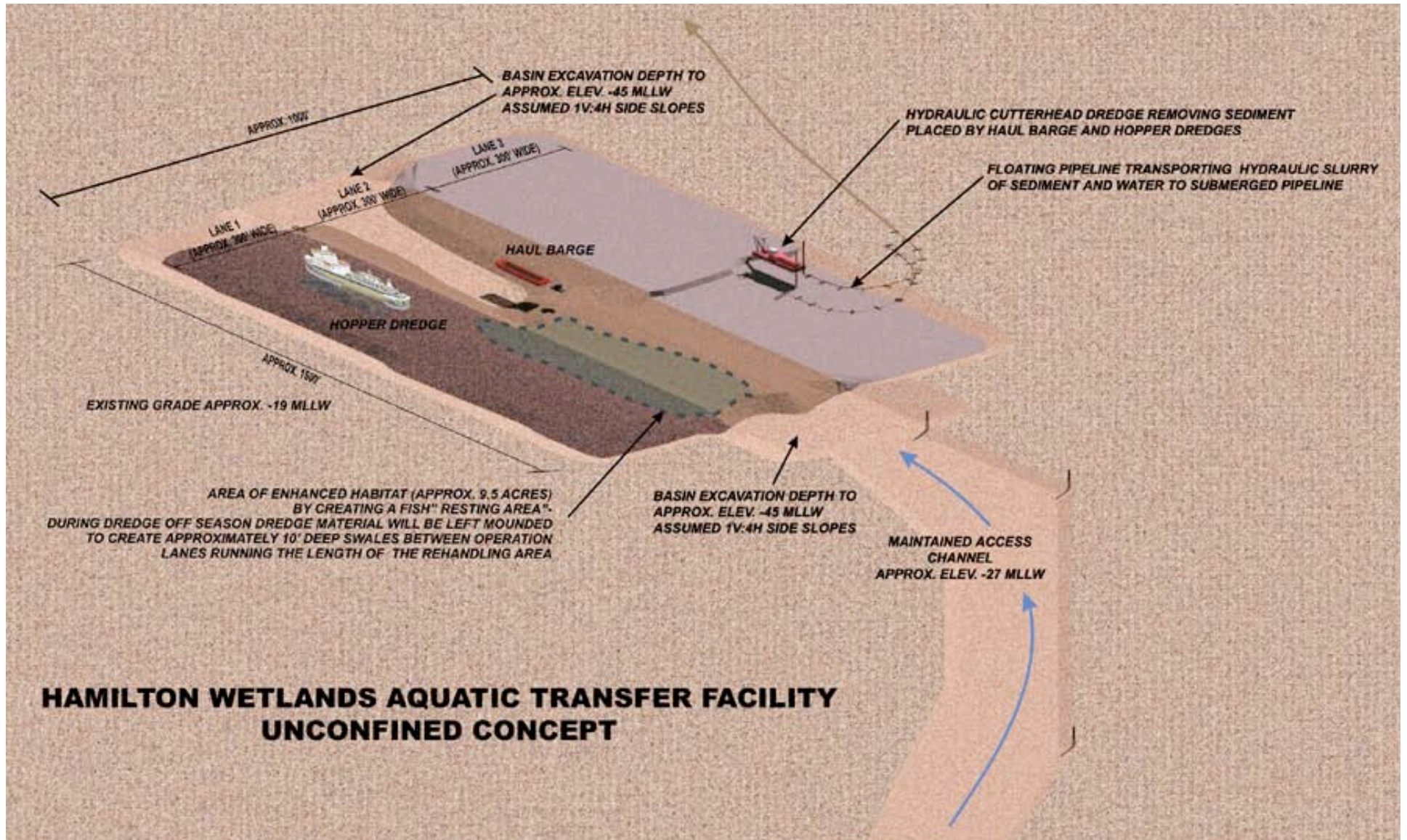
Actual Dredging Has Been Decreasing Overall



•“Bin volume”

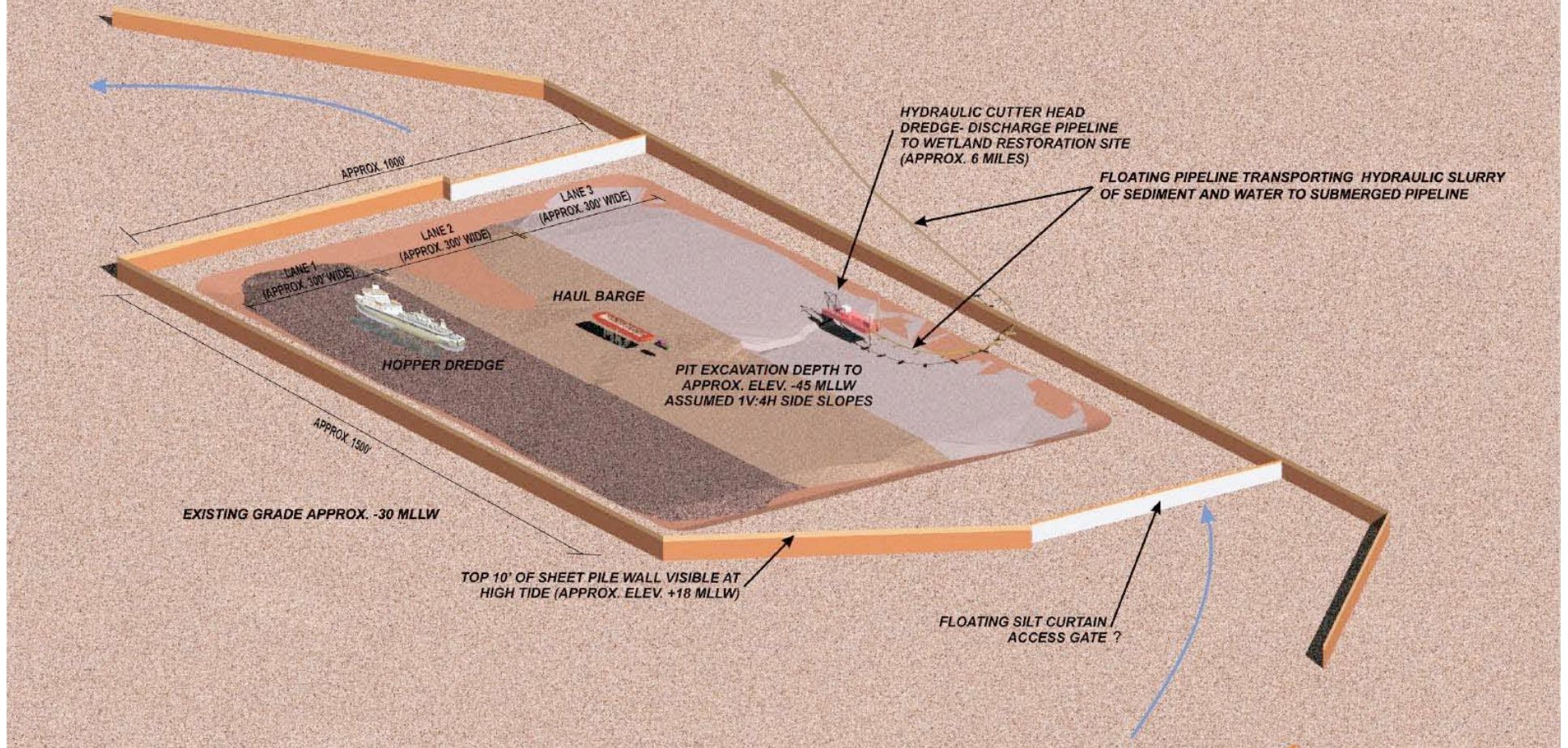


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HAMILTON WETLANDS AQUATIC TRANSFER FACILITY CONFINED CONCEPT



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
